SHECODE PARTNERSHIP



<u>SheCodes</u> helps provide women in developing countries with the opportunity to learn how to code for free. Women currently hold 25% of coding jobs and earn 30% less money than men. In most developing countries, more than 65% of women don't have bank accounts and cannot afford to invest in their education. SheCodes currently work in 50 countries worldwide and we are blessed to be their partner in these countries: Ghana, Kenya, South Sudan, Tanzania, and Uganda.

What is coding? Coding tells a computer which actions to perform and how to complete tasks and in turn helps humans accurately communicate with computers.

The question is: Why should women in developing countries learn how to code? It's simple... coding knowledge can help women in developing countries accomplish the following:

*Get a Job in Tech (and possibly work from home/remotely)

- *Grow Their Skill Sets to increase their eligibility to get a job
- *Improve Their Analytical Thinking



To be accepted into the program, students simply need to complete these requirements:

- *Reside in one of the countries where SheCodes works
- *Have access to a computer/internet
- *Have financial and educational difficulties
- *Are motivated to learn how to code

Because all of our labs, located in the countries listed above, have working computers, all female students from these labs are eligible! We hope to share, later, how many students have taken this opportunity and we hope there are many!

THE "OUT" DOOR


