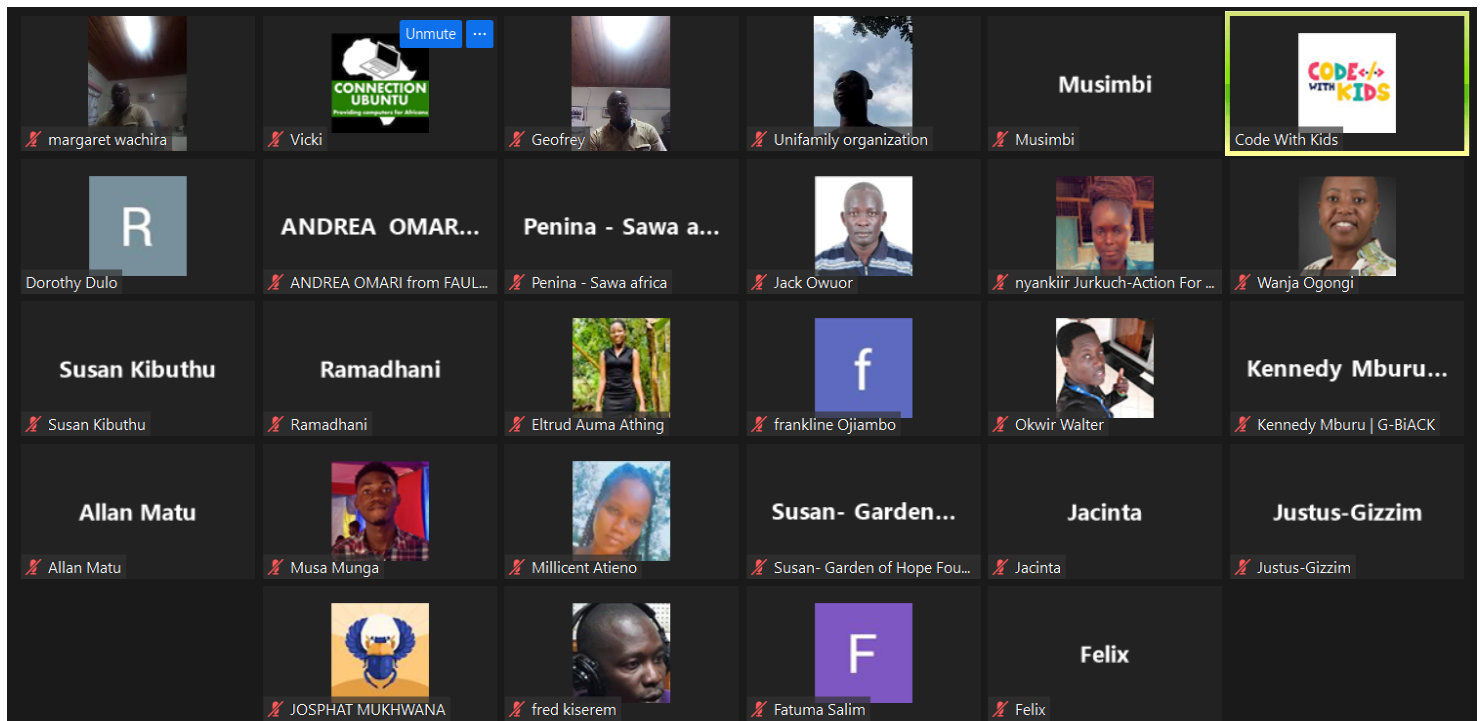

Last year, after our Summit meeting in January with our computer lab directors, we decided to have a monthly zoom meeting so that our computer labs could network and also invite speakers for learning purposes. It has been a huge success and is now a requirement of Connection Ubuntu that a representative from each computer lab attend at least nine out of our twelve meetings per year. We generally have a speaker that will teach a skill and the time is also used to collaborate ideas for fundraising, self-sustainability, etc. We now have approximately 55 computer labs in Africa and our last meeting in March was well attended with 36 labs represented. There have been some hurdles with time zones and network issues in Africa, but all of our attendees are thrilled with the information they’ve learned. Being part of this group also gives the attendees commendation when applying for grants. We’re hoping that, in the future, all of the labs have at least one attendee and that the numbers continue to grow.



# OUR TWO YEAR COMPUTER LAB ACHIEVEMENTS

Congratulations to our newest group of computer labs who have earned their certificates in completing Connection Ubuntu's two year computer lab requirements. Our prospective partners sign contracts prior to receiving their computers agreeing to the following: they must have at least 50% of their students be female, and send us reports three times per year in April, July and November for two years. 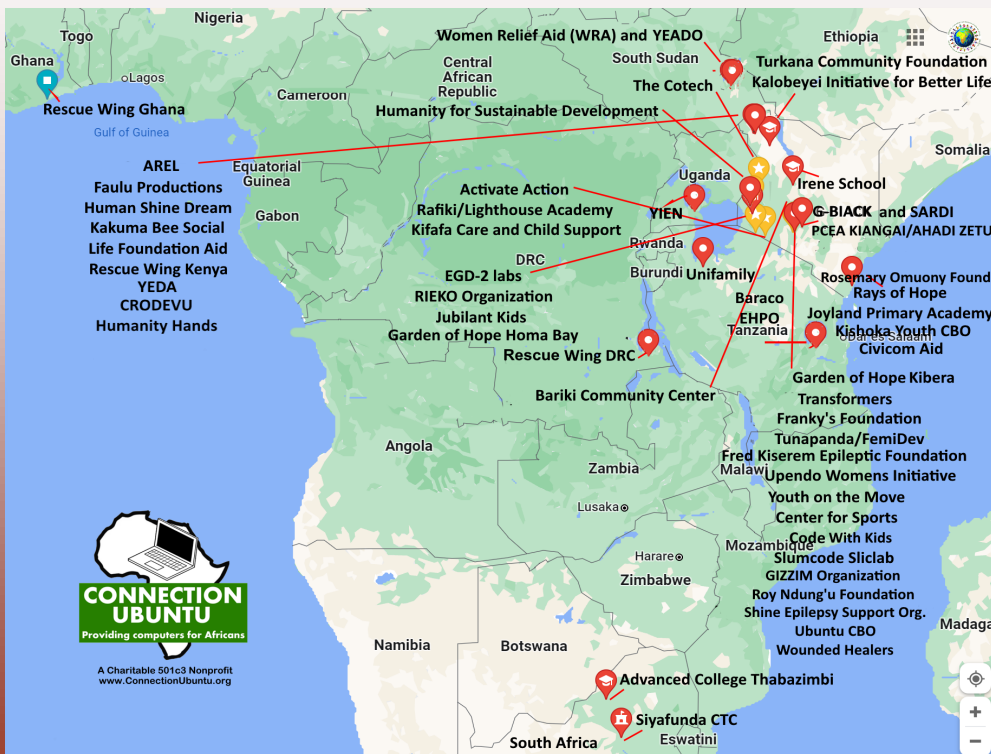
