SIYAFUNDA—CHANGING LIVES IN SOUTH AFRICA

<u>Siyafunda CTC</u> is one of our newer computer lab partners, located in Katlehong, South Africa. They have huge plans to use their computer lab to educate their community. Their lab has been named "Ubuntu Connection Learning Café," which aligns with the idea of lifelong learning, where individuals continuously seek knowledge and skills throughout their lives to adapt to changing circumstances and personal growth. The Learning Café serves other uses such as a Self-Study Zone, Internet Browsing, Emailing and Typing, Online Job Search and Interviews, and as an Assignment Homework Lab. In their last quarter, they taught 59 women and 32 men. They are truly changing their community. These programs give each person some way to learn technology. We're so proud of their work.

In their words, "At Siyafunda Community Technology Center, we are dedicated to hosting, attending, and running various programs both within communities and internally. Our track record speaks for itself, as we have successfully supported a wide range of audiences for the Ubuntu lab to date. However, we are not stopping there. We have ambitious plans to integrate additional programs such as "self-study" and "work-from-home" initiatives to the lab as it has been assigned a dedicated place."

Their mission is to create environments and experiences that train lifelong learners, earners, and problem-solvers. Tunapanda's graduates and beneficiaries go on to become successful professionals, freelancers, and entrepreneurs — while engaging in creative self-expression that gives them and their communities a greater voice.
